

## What are Cookies?

Cookies are small amounts of information which some websites store on your computer to make it easier for you to log on to and use them during future visits. In reality, a cookie is a small text file which is stored by the user's browser and contains data, not code, so it can't contain a virus or spyware. This doesn't mean that all cookies are harmless in intent, but they can only ever store information.

## How we use your information

CMSUK uses 'analytical' cookies on this site to allow us to monitor website traffic and analyse how visitors use it via Google Analytics. This service tracks information about how visitors interact with the site, including the number of visitors to our website, where visitors have come to the website from, and the pages they visit. We use this information to help us improve our website.

Such information will not identify you personally as it is merely statistical data about our visitors and their use of our website. This statistical data is completely anonymous and does not identify any personal details whatsoever.

The cookies we use on our site include Google Analytics cookies (`_utma`, `_utmb`, `_utmc`, `_utmt`, `_utmz`), as referenced above, as well as a laravel session cookie. This cookie will only remain on your browser whilst you are on the site and is used to give further statistical data of how visitors use our website. Once you've left the website, this cookie will be removed from your browser.

All computers have the ability to decline cookies. You can configure your web browser to refuse cookies, or to be informed if a cookie is set. You can find out how to do this by clicking "help" on your browser menu.
