As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, Case Managers and other healthcare professionals have evolved their service delivery using remote formats such as video conferencing and telephone consultations. CMSUK is keen to explore the existing evidence for the effectiveness of such remote healthcare service delivery, to share with its members and inform the industry.

We are pleased to announce that following a call for expression of interest from CMSUK members for proposals for brief literature review, three projects have been selected for funding. Each of the following projects will be awarded £2,000.00 on completion of the project.

1. **Christa Wright from Christa Wright Limited** for *“A rapid literature review of case management via video conferencing: exploring the barriers and facilitators”*
2. **Claire Lowther and Dr Devdeep Ahuja** for *“Selection criteria for safe and effective remote delivery of case management services: a brief literature review”*
3. **Dr Peter Tucker and Dr Sophie Gosling** for *“Telerehabilitation: Remote assessment and treatment - review of the evidence and its relationship with Case Management competencies”*

The CMSUK Research Committee felt that these reviews will address specific topical aspects of remote working in case management and provide practical, actionable outcomes which can influence practice. It is anticipated that the articles from these projects will be published on CMSUK website in early July.
