



Occupational and Vocational Rehabilitation

Start thinking about your career development this New Year!

Our [MSc Occupational and Vocational Rehabilitation](#) programme focuses on health and wellbeing in relation to work (or other meaningful occupation). It brings together the disciplines of occupational and vocational rehabilitation, with the intention of improving collaboration for effective coordination and delivery of health, social care and workplace health systems.

In **February 2017**, we will be running our Semester two modules which can be taken as **standalone modules**. Successful completion of each module gives 30 credits at level 7 and you can use these to build up to a post graduate award (MSc, PGDip, or PGCert).

Semester two modules

Assessments and Interventions for Occupational and Vocational Rehabilitation

Covers a range of physical, psychological, and organisational strategies that will support effective rehabilitation, with a focus applicable to your own practice area. You will also explore the obstacles and facilitators to an individual's ability to work and use hypothetical case studies/ examples to apply theory to practice.

Long-term Conditions and Vocational Case Management

Examines long-term conditions in relation to work; identifies quality case management principles and approaches for client-centred rehabilitation for a range of complex presentations and perspectives. You will develop a critical awareness the relationships between work, health and wellbeing for a range of long term physical and mental health conditions.

You might consider taking this course to progress in an industry that you already have experience in, re-skill for a different career path or continue the studies you took as an undergraduate.
